FOOTMAN JAMES HAVE MMOC 40th ANNIVERSARY CHARITY MARATHON COVERED

Morris Minor Owners Club (MMOC) insurance partners, [Footman James](#), specialists in classic car insurance, have weighed in to offer their support to the **40th Anniversary Charity Marathon from John O'Groats to Land's End** by offering fully comprehensive driver cover for any MMOC member who is asked to drive the car during the month long trip around the UK.

In September 2016, the club is celebrating its ruby anniversary by taking a standard specification **1963 Morris Minor 4 door saloon** on a celebration trip throughout the UK. The aim is to travel from John O'Groats to Land's End but, instead of going directly, the car will, over a period of 4 weeks, visit every MMOC branch in the UK as well as a number of additional locations that are significant to the history of the car and the development of the club since 1976. Amongst these will be the site of the former Morris works at Cowley, where the car was built, the British Motor Museum at Gaydon, the National Motor Museum at Beaulieu and the home of the founder of Morris Motors, Nuffield Place.

Whilst the car is on its marathon journey around the UK, the club has chosen to link with Marie Curie to use the trip, and many of the national and local activities planned throughout 2016, to raise much needed funds to support the work of the charity. With this in mind, the car will also visit all nine Marie Curie residential hospices on its expected 3,500 mile journey.

Speaking for the MMOC, **Club Secretary** and renowned Morris Minor historian **Ray Newell**

"The MMOC has had successful relationship with Footman James for many years now and we are thrilled by their generous offer of support for our charity marathon run. Making sure that the car is properly insured throughout the marathon is very important to us but this was quite a complicated challenge given the number of drivers we will need to ensure a successful event. Thankfully, the support of Footman James has made this challenge much simpler and we are very grateful to have their support"

MMOC Charity Marathon organiser, Bruce Kelsey explained how the agreement will work:

"Footman James have agreed to extend the existing fully comprehensive policy on our charity car to cover all members of the MMOC aged 17 and over who are fully paid up members of the club and who have a clean driving licence."

Speaking for Footman James, Managing Director, David Bond said

"We are incredibly proud of our relationship with the Morris Minor Owners Club and are only too happy to support the 40th anniversary charity marathon in any way we can. We recognise the importance of the run to both the club and to Marie Curie and we are pleased to be associated with it and to play a part in its success. Our staff are actively engaged in our own John O'Groats to Land's End Challenge which is also raising money for Marie Curie and we are looking forward to welcoming the car to our Dudley offices on September 14th"

Note to Editors:

- The MMOC Charity Marathon will involve the car driving from point to point on a pre-arranged schedule. This schedule is included in this pack.
- At all times, the car will have a driver and co-driver. The route taken by the car between each stop will be determined by the driver on the day and will take into account road closures and traffic conditions at the time.
- MMOC branches have organised events locally at which the car will appear as it makes its way to Land's End. In some areas, the event is a fundraising stop – perhaps at a local supermarket where events are planned and where MMOC and Marie Curie volunteers will be actively raising funds for the charity. These events are likely to continue for the whole day. In others areas, the local event will be a lower key photo opportunity where funds raised by the branch during previous events will be recognised, presented and logged.
- The car will stop at such locations for no more than 2 hours before continuing on its way. At designated press/publicity stops, the car will arrive and will be situated so that photos may be taken. Fund raising MAY occur at such venues subject to permission being granted by the site owners.
- Press/media are welcome to attend any of the stops during the run should they so wish. It would be helpful for us if you could contact us as soon as possible to let us know you are coming. We accept that the news cycle on the day may prevent you from attending. If this is so we hope you will find other ways to highlight what we are doing.
- We welcome the opportunity to give live or pre-recorded interviews, contribute to articles and participate in any TV or radio programmes that will help us raise the profile of the MMOC, enhance the ongoing appeal of the Morris Minor or highlight the valuable and essential work of Marie Curie.

PRESS/MEDIA BACKGROUND INFORMATION

THE MORRIS MINOR OWNERS CLUB (MMOC)

Our aims are simply to promote the preservation and use of the post-war Morris Minor, 1.6 million of which were built between 1948 and 1971.

The Morris Minor was designed by Sir Alec Issigonis (also the creator of the Mini) and built by William Morris (Lord Nuffield) and later by the British Motor Corporation and then British Leyland. Its innovative design, simplicity, durability and style have created fame and familiarity known the world over.

The MMOC exists to unite these people who have a fondness of these loveable 'jellymoulds', and those people who still use them as everyday transport.

Objectives of the Club include:

- Providing technical support and help with the location of spare parts
- Organising more than fifty events on the annual calendar, with concours competition to the highest standards; large auto-jumbles; trade stands; displays and competitions; social meetings and parties

7143 HA is a **1963 Morris Minor 4 door saloon**. It is essentially a standard 1098cc saloon but has been fitted with uprated electronic ignition. Other than that it is a standard, as-it-left-the-factory car.
